We, ensure quality education by adopting experiential and active learning for the all-round development of the students through life-skills and value-based education. The school is equipped with various educational facilities which includes Digitalised classrooms with Smart boards, Separate Junior and Senior Computer labs, Physics, Chemistry, Bio and Math Labs. School also has inbuilt activities such as Art, Music, Yoga, Martial Arts, Dance, Mass P.T and various sports & indoor-games into the curriculum. ### AMRITA FEST – An extra-curricular program..

Is designed to encourage students to tap their innate talents and develop healthy competition. This year Amrita fest was conducted in two parts, both filled with excitement and enthusiasm.

Each activity allowed students to showcase their skills and creativity.

**Amrita Fest 2** was planned with yet another set of interesting competitions where students exhibited their creativity in Drawing , Picture Saga Storytelling, Animal House Making , Bird House Building, Solo Dance, Guru Stotram Chanting, Mandala Art , Pot Painting, Persuasive Speech, Creative Recipe making, Role-Play Challenges, and Debate.

#### **AMRITAM PROJECTS**

Amma's vision of 'Education for life' is practiced by our students through Amritam Projects. This initiative is a remarkable example of social commitment, ensuring that students not just learn values but also practice them from a young age. **Sevamritam** is an activity where students collect rice every Tuesday and save a portion of their pocket money to help those in need. A key aspect of this project is encouraging generosity. This year along with rice, the contributions were used to purchase essential groceries for underprivileged families. These efforts highlight the power of community and compassion, while instilling in students valuable lessons of empathy and care for fellow humans.

In the activity of Bhutayagnam, the small children are taught to care for birds by feeding them bajra and water. Under the **Grihamritam** initiative, students take back the values learnt at

school. They practice them through ways of assisting their parents in small house hold activities like cleaning the rooms, cooking, arranging things, gardening, ironing, folding clothes so on...

# FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES:-

As per CBSE norms, our school faculty consists of qualified teachers with relevant teaching experiences. Personality development and In-house trainings are organised for the teachers at regular intervals during the year.

- On April 25<sup>th</sup> a session for teachers on the importance of Body Language was conducted by Ms. Akshata Popli, a clinical psychologist and remedial educator. She highlighted how non-verbal signs like facial expressions, gestures, posture, and eye contact influence communication. Through roleplay and slides, teachers learnt to interpret these signals to improve interactions with students, enhancing both teaching and learning experiences.
- On July 26<sup>th</sup> the School counsellor engaged all the teachers on the ways and techniques of "Dealing with challenging students" through an interesting role play. She also communicated how to guarantee students' dedication, commitment, class attendance, and discipline in work by creating a healthy rapport with children.
- > Yet another CBSE training on Cyber safety and security is planned for Dec 28<sup>th</sup> 2024.

## **ENRICHMENT PROGRAMMES FOR STUDENTS**

- On 25<sup>th</sup> April, AYUDH team conducted an orientation session for students of Class 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> to introduce **Ayudh's mission**, beliefs and current projects. Around 60 students were initiated as AYUDH members to instil the passion and commitment to take forward the mission of AYUDH. From 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> October, over 40 Ayudh students got an opportunity to visit Amma's Ashram at Amritapuri, the Headquarters of the Mata Amritanandamayi Math in Kerala. The visit included a tour to Amrita University, showcasing Amma's humanitarian projects and the fusion of science and spirituality. The students engaged with various innovative projects, from robotics to sustainable energy solutions, inspiring them to apply their technical skills for social good. They also experienced Amma's Darshan, meditation, and a deep connection with nature through activities like Gau Seva and visits to organic gardens. The trip culminated in a transformative experience, leaving the AYUDHians with lasting memories and a renewed commitment to service.
- In the month of July students of classes 3 to 8 had a fantastic time engaging in diverse club activities such as Language & Literacy Club, Innovation Club, Fun with Maths Club, Eco & Heritage Club. These hands-on activities not only made learning exciting but also fostered essential skills and awareness. One of the reasons why children love club activities is that teachers and students actively engage with each other in an informal setting. They also work in groups which promotes social behavior.

- An amazing Mobile Planetarium Show (Tarangan) for all students from Nursery to Grade XII was organized from 27th of July. Students became cosmic explorers, surrounded by the stunning beauty of stars, planets, and galaxies. This immersive experience went beyond the usual textbooks, bringing astronomy to life with vibrant audio-visuals. It was a show filled with wonder and learning as our students connected with the universe in ways they'd never imagined before.
- A comprehensive 'Eye Check Up' camp for students was arranged for 5 days from 15<sup>th</sup> July, conducted by expert team from Shri Ramakrishna Netralay. Students actively participated, understanding the importance of regular eye check-ups for their overall well-being. Each student received a detailed report of their eye health, and those needing further consultation were identified for follow-up.
- Cyber safety program was organized for the parents which aimed to raise awareness among parents, staff, and students about the growing threat of cyber-crime, particularly concerning the youth's use of technology. Dr. Vishal Mane, Inspector of Police and cyber security expert headed the session and educated the parent community.
- The school hosted a successful two-day medical camp organized by the Vijay Nahata Foundation, which was focused on dental health. Each student received a comprehensive check-up and a dental health kit and personalized prescription.
- > A career guidance session was conducted for secondary classes by our faculty.
- On 2<sup>nd</sup> September, Kalari Payattu arts training session was started. Students learned Ashva vadiva (the horse stance) for strength and balance, practiced leg-raising techniques for flexibility, and worked on the Thekkan style punch for precision. The class concluded with the chanting of traditional mantras, instilling discipline and respect. The first session laid a strong foundation for the students' journey in Kalari Payattu.
- On September 21<sup>st</sup>, the school organized a community outreach program that welcomed 30 visually impaired individuals from Mumbai. Students from classes 11 and 12 took the lead in hosting the event, which fostered empathy and understanding through joyful activities like antakshari, showcasing the impressive musical talents of the guests. Students presented care packages with essential items and served food with love, creating an emotional bond.
- Amrita Vidyalayam conducted a workshop on personality development for std X which focused on developing the mental strength and understanding. The program was conducte by Dr. Malini Frey and her team of social work graduates from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> of October.
- Class-wise sessions were conducted in the month of October to sensitize children about "Good and Bad Touch" to help them understand the importance of personal safety and boundaries. School counsellor Ms. Gayatri Nathani teamed with IXth and Xth-grade volunteers, taught students how to identify safe and unsafe touches, and how to respond appropriately during

danger. The children learnt to recognize "No Touch" areas and how to refuse unwanted touch and were also taught whom to trust and report in case of an emergency. The goal was to empower children with the knowledge and confidence to protect themselves and ensure their well-being.

On November 28th, the School conducted a Fire Mock Drill Session aimed to ensure safety of our students and staff. The team of expert fire officers from Nerul Fire Station demonstrated how to use firefighting equipment like fire extinguishers and shared practical tips on acting swiftly during a fire outbreak. They also shared the life-saving method of "Stop, Drop, and Roll" as part of fire safety. The session ended with valuable insights on how to act promptly and wisely during fire emergencies.

### A GLIMPSE OF VARIOUS EVENTS AND CELEBRATIONS DURING THE YEAR.

- On 5th June World Environment Day was celebrated by organizing different activities to create awareness among students towards the environment. With a speech and a melodious song students gave the message of the importance of saving trees. Students of class 12 displayed colourful posters with slogans to conserve and protect nature.
- On June 8th, Investiture Ceremony and the felicitation of Class X and XII toppers of the year 2023-24 was conducted. Trophies and certificates were awarded to the Board Toppers of the school. The newly elected school council members pledged to uphold the school's vision by repeating the oath administered by the Principal.
- On June 21<sup>st</sup>, International Day of Yoga was celebrated honoring the ancient practice that nurtures the mind, body, and soul guided by Brni. Sharanyamrita Chaitanya. The day saw a collective yoga session featuring warm-ups, asanas, and breathing exercises, engaging 1,700 students from classes 1 to 12. A special highlight was an exclusive session on Swara Yoga by Dr. Trupti Digge, who shared insights on its benefits and techniques for optimal brain function.
- The School had organized a one day picnic for all the classes to provide a days entertainment and explore with fun amidst their regular academic schedule. The children enjoyed the day with their friends and teachers.
- On July 20<sup>th</sup> Guru Purnima was celebrated with heartfelt devotion and reverance. The day began with a serene Kartika Puja, led by Brni. Sharanyamrita Chaitanya. The event was enriched by inspiring tales of the devotees of Lord Vitthal, illustrating the profound impact of faith. This celebration not only fostered togetherness but also provided a meaningful platform for students to express gratitude to their mentors, re-inforcing the significance of spiritual teachings in our educational journey.
- 78th Independence Day was celebrated with Dr.Vishal Mane, Inspector of Police (cyber crime branch) as the chief guest who did the honor of hoisting the flag. Administrator Brni.
